### **Report Updates:**

### **Statue Approval Application**

The following advice has now been received from the Parks Victoria representative [Andrew Kelly]. Andrew replaces Julia Street who has now taken up the position of District Manager, Parks Victoria. This encompasses all of South East Melbourne as well as Point Nepean. Julia has been very supportive of our Statue Project and, in her upgraded appointment, this bodes well for the statue approval proposal.

Below is an extract from the recent communication from Andrew Kelly:

# Email dated 26 Sep 2019:

"Good afternoon,

I am writing on behalf of the Point Nepean team to introduce myself and provide you with an update on recent staffing changes in relation to the Point Nepean Master Plan Implementation Team, as well as the progress of the **storytelling and interpretation project.** 

**Staff Update:** Julia Street, Business Development and Activation Manager for Point Nepean, has begun a new role within Parks Victoria as District Manager, South East Melbourne. Point Nepean National Park is part of the South East Melbourne District park network and Julia will continue to be

involved with the Point Nepean Master Plan implementation program. I have since been appointed to a three-month secondment to backfill Julia's position through to December pending a formal recruitment process. I come with a focus on project / capital works delivery and a strong familiarity of the park having been the lead project manager for the recent Defence Road upgrade.

I would also like to inform you of the appointment of two new staff members in the shared role of Project Coordinator, Point Nepean Master Plan Team. Jaye Cook and Kim Cott will work closely with me on the implementation of the early funded initiatives announced by the Minister with the release of the <u>Point Nepean Master Plan</u>. Jaye will be working specifically on the storytelling and interpretation, and Kim will be working on the amenity upgrade and new camping experience projects."

**Comment:** Our Local Parks Vic Liaison Team in John Wilson and Robin McBride will remain the Point-of-Contact for the Statue Project.

Andrew further sent the Team the following:

### **Storytelling & Interpretation Project**

"I am pleased to advise that the <u>Point Nepean National Park Storytelling and Interpretation Strategy</u> is now complete and available as a public document <u>here</u>. This strategy is a long-term vision for integrated parkwide storytelling and interpretation that leverages off Point Nepean's complex history, stories and natural assets to provide a world-class experience.

The strategy defines how the stories will be told across the site and includes six key elements:

- 1. Narrative trails revealing the stories of the Bunurong and the Natural World
- 2. An immersive experience within the Quarantine Station Disinfecting Complex
- 3. New Visitor Centre
- 4. New Bunurong Centre
- 5. Refurbished experience at Fort Nepean
- 6. Digital tools to enable visitors to plan and engage deeper with the stories

Our immediate focus will be to deliver the agreed priorities within the current funding available and required processes. This includes delivering narrative trails that tell the stories of the natural world and traditional owner stories of the Bunurong, and an immersive experience within the Quarantine Station Disinfecting Complex. Uplifts to selected heritage listed buildings within the Disinfecting Complex will also be undertaken to ensure their conservation and allow them to house the interpretative information that will tell the quarantine stories.

Additional funding will be required to deliver the new Visitor Centre experience, refurbish the experience at Fort Nepean, develop more in depth digital tools such as the microsite and other signature experiences. We will also continue to work closely with appropriate third parties on their proposals to enhance specific interpretive experiences such as the Bunurong Centre, the Officer Cadet School memorial, Fort Nepean gun emplacements 5 & 6 restoration, and the Harold Holt Memorial upgrade.

I would like to take this opportunity to <u>thank you</u> for your participation and valuable input into the stakeholder workshops hosted by Parks Victoria and Buro North in March earlier this year. This co-design process has delivered a more robust strategy with well-defined story themes and established a collaborative approach that I aim to continue to strengthen with you during the implementation phase of this project".

### **Notes:**

- 1. By clicking on to the <u>Storytelling and Interpretation Strategy</u> reference listed above and following the prompts, the full copy of the Buro North Submission is available for Alumni Members' information. Please note that the spelling of the Traditional Owners differs from that listed in our re-constructed Website. Our Website spelling is taken from the Traditional Owners' Website but for sake of accuracy it will need to be verified. Action: John Wilson/Robin McBride to take it up on our behalf.
- 2. The Visitor's Centre listed above also indicates a segment devoted to Military matters. It is therefore relevant that a brief outline of the OCS History is displayed in this centre. Action: John Wilson/Robin McBride to follow up.
- 3. The Officer Cadet School Memorial proposal is mentioned in the report [but NOT approved at this time]. In a 'phone report from our Local Liaison Team on 2 Oct 2019, contact has now been made with Andrew Kelly [Parks Vic rep]. We are hopeful of early consideration by the various levels of the responsible Authority. The Local Liaison Team will continue to follow up the proposal.
